


#### 5.1. Strategic Themes

Based on a comprehensive strategic analysis of the University the following strategic themes were identified for action:

#### **Reorganization and Consolidation of Records**

In 2022, the central administration embarked on the reorganization of records in the defunct departments and Centres such as (ODeL, Board of Common Undergraduate Courses (BCUC) and Centre for International programs and Links (CIPL). the records were transferred those records to the University Archives for secure storage and controlled access. These were among the records identified for digitization. Further, the division developed an electronic records classification and indexing scheme which is currently in use. Further the division embarked in digitizing the current staff personal files and transferring current staff personal files and closed staff personal files from the faculties. The division revised the records classification and indexing scheme in alignment with the current University of Nairobi administrative structure.

#### **Staff Sensitization on Business Process Re-Engineering**

In 2022, the Central Administration organized and sensitized University Management, Deans of Faculties, Associate Deans, Faculty Registrars and Accountants on Business Process Re-engineering. 117 staff were trained on this direction in the university

### **Implementation of Reforms**

In 2022, the university implemented a number of reforms as follows:

#### **Rationalization of Programme Portfolio**

Apart form discontinuing academic programmes to pave way for a fresh portfolio of courses, there was development of new curricula as follows:

Approval of four new curricula for strategic programmes; Diploma in Teacher Education in Emergencies; Postgraduate Diploma in Gender-Based Violence in Emergencies; Bachelor of Science Data Science, and Master of Science Data Science.

Additionally curricula were revised in eight Faculties at three programme levels. They were concentrated in STEM programmes aligned to food security; health; housing and manufacturing.

Staff and students also received wellness checks for body mass, cancer screening, diabetes, blood pressure and HIV/AIDS and other health parameters.

#### **World Health Day**

The University marked the World Health Day with special emphasis on prostate and breast cancer in April, 2022 The event included panel discussions on the prevention and management of prostrate and breast cancer, as well as various cancer screening and other health parameters.

#### **World Mental Health Day**

The University of Nairobi held the Annual Mental Health Awareness Commemoration in October, 2022. During the event, a team of experts drawn from the University Healthcare Services (UHS), in collaboration with partners joined hands to offer health screening for various cancers including breast and cervical cancer. The team also conducted VCT, blood sugar and blood pressure testing, eye examination, cardiovascular evaluation, alcohol and drug abuse awareness, reproductive health awareness, and counseling.

#### **Celebrating The World Aids Day**

The University marked the World AIDS Day in December, 2022. A number of activities that included a procession from the University Health Services to Taifa Hall and a free medical camp at the Great Court were important features. Free tests conducted by the University and its partners included HIV testing; eye check-up; cervical and breast cancer screening; blood sugar screening; mental health assessment; COVID-19 vaccination as well discussions on well being, diet and exercise.

### IMPLEMENTATION OF THE O3 PLUS PROJECT

In 2022, the University implemented the our rights, our lives, our future or 03 plus project. The project, run in conjunction with UNESCO, seeks to ensure that young people in higher and tertiary education Institutions in Eastern and Southern Africa realize positive health, education and gender equality outcomes through sustained reductions in new HIV infections, unintended pregnancy and gender based violence.

155 staff and students participated in a 5Km walk in Thika town on Friday, February 11, 2022 to raise awareness of the O3Plus Project. They were joined by their partners UNESCO and Mount Kenya University, in this walk to raise awareness for the students' physical and health wellness while in campus and to integrate the community interests with the students' well being. The walk was one of the key advocacy activities part implemented under the O3 Plus project.

#### Hiking Mt. Kenya

In a related activity, University students hiked Mt. Kenya on July 14-17, 2022 to raise awareness of the O3 Plus project. The students underwent 6 preparatory hikes and were given training by outdoor KE by scaling Mt. Kilimambogo, Kijabe Hills; Mt. Longonot; Elephant Hills; Mackinder's Quest and Oldonyo Le Satima to build their resilience.



The symbolic importance of the hike was to articulate the initiative from the mountain top. Mt. Kenya is symbolic because it is the highest mountain in Kenya and the flag of Kenya, the constitution has been deposited at the Lenana peak, which is an indication of how much the University values young people's rights, lives and their future. The O3Plus flag was hoisted at point Lenana.

#### Training of O3 Plus Champions

In another activity, The University of Nairobi trained 40 Champions, to support the implementation of O3 Plus activities in 10 Campuses; on October 25-26, 2022. The students were taken through training on HIV; sexual and gender-based violence; sexual and reproductive health and rights, mental health and well-being as well as interpersonal and meaningful peer to peer engagement and communication.

#### **Launch of Gender Resource Centre**

In 2022, the World AIDS Day celebrations at the university were marked by the establishment and launch of the first ever UoN Gender Resource Center. The Resource Centre is domiciled at the University Health Services, and has been established within the #O3plus project that the University has been implementing with support from UNESCO and the Swedish Government and in partnership with UN Women.

#### **Student Safe Spaces**

In 2022, the The O3 Plus project, Our Rights, Our Lives, Our Future worked on creating safe spaces for campus students and increasing their well-being. One of the features was a gender space, that it is envisaged will facilitate social gender issues and equality and address the issues as appropriate.

### LAUNCH AND ESTABLISHMENT OF NEW CENTRES

#### **African Centre for The Study of the United States of America**



In 2022, the University of Nairobi launched the Center for the Study of the United States of America (ACSUS) in Kenya. The centre is domiciled under the Department of Diplomacy and International Studies, and will focus on diaspora issues while researching the consolidated USA as a society, country and its Status as a global superpower.

#### **ARUA Centre of Excellence for Non Communicable Diseases**



In 2022, the University launched the ARUA Centre of Excellence for non-communicable Diseases. The Centre is one of the 13 ARUA Centres of excellence that are held across African Universities run on a Hub and Spoke Model, and a partnership between five high Research Intensive African Universities- The University of Nairobi (Hub), Makerere University (Uganda); The University of Ghana (Ghana); University of Ibadan (Nigeria) and University of Witwatersrand (South Africa). The Centre also collaborates with UK partner Universities namely University of Glasgow and Leicester University.

#### **UON Centre for Health Care and Innovation**

In 2022, the University commissioned the center, which will house Fahari ya Jamii, a USAID funded project to increase equitable access and use of quality county-led health services in Nairobi and Kajiado counties.

The center will also handle the response, integration and strengthening of the Project Plus (CRISSP+) project which aims at building the capacity of the public health response in Kirinyaga and Kiambu counties to achieve and maintain universal access to quality HIV prevention, care and treatment services with particular focus on county Government and community ownership, integration with broader health and developmental context.

#### **International Institute of Online Education-Kenya National Centre**

In 2022, the University launched and hosted an international institute that will serve as a national and regional hub, and create a supportive local higher education ecosystem contributing to realizing Kenya's national development strategies. It will also Empower the digital transformation of research, capacity building; online course construction and sharing, technical support and networking in higher education institutes.

#### **African Hub for Sustainable Creative Economies, Nairobi**

In 2022, the university established the African Hub for Sustainable Creative Economies (AISCE), which is a collaborative project between King's College London, University of Southampton, University of Lagos; the University of Nairobi and the University of Witwaters Rand.

The project aim is to support the development of sustainable creative economies in Africa by fostering connections between higher education institutions as creative entrepreneurs; collecting and sharing career development stories, and strengthening the profile of research in creative economies. The focus of the Nairobi hub is fashion and design.

#### **Animal Health Molecular and Diagnostic Laboratory**

In 2022, the university established the Animal Health Molecular and Diagnostic Laboratory, which is a collaborative initiative between the University of Nairobi and Washington State University. The Lab aims to improve the control of East Coast Fever, a major impediment to the establishment and growth of cattle in Eastern, Central and Southern Africa.

#### Science for Weather Information and Forecasting Techniques Laboratory

In 2022, the university launched a Science for Weather Information and Forecasting Techniques (SWIFT) Laboratory. The Laboratory, which is open to external users on request is important for advancement of weather forecasting for decision making; monitoring by acquisition of real time global scale weather data from satellites; Numerical modelling based on high performance computing and processing short-term weather information products for teaching and research.

#### **The Sustainable Development Solutions Network**

In 2022, the university supported the launch of the sustainable development solution network's 2022-2026 Strategic Plan. The sustainable solutions network is domiciled at the Department of Diplomacy and International Studies and co-hosted with Moi University. The network is a part of the Global UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network (UN-SDSN) tasked with prompting solutions, policies and public education on the implementation of the SDGs in Kenya.

### INTERNATIONAL EVENTS HOSTED



#### **Inauguration of The Global Champion for The Africa Adaptation Acceleration Program**

In 2022, the university organised a Leaders dialogue on climate adaptation during which there was endorsement and interaction with leaders such as the GCA Chair and 8th Secretary-General of the United Nations, Ban Ki-moon; African Development Bank Group President, Dr Akinwumi Adesina; World Trade Organization Director Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala; and IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva.

President Kenyatta thanked former Secretary-General Ban Ki moon and GCA CEO Professor Patrick Verkooijen for giving him the role of AAAP Global Champion. He said: "Africa has been most adversely affected by climate change. Adaptation is not just important. It is a survival strategy." Kenyatta recognized the joint efforts of the three multilateral institution heads "for their tireless efforts in championing the adaptation agenda." He said: "I am confident that with support from friends like these, we shall reach our goal."

#### **Celebration of International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Drug Trafficking**

In 2022, the National Authority for the Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA) enjoined the university community in commemorating the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking also known as the World Drug Day. Ms. Winnie Guchu, Chief Administrative Secretary (CAS), Ministry of Interior and Coordination of National Government participated in the commemoration of this global event by flagging off a 2 kilometer walk and where participants converged at the University of Nairobi's Chancellor's Court.



The International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, or World Drug Day, is marked on June 26 every year to strengthen action and cooperation in achieving a world free of drug abuse. The event was commemorated in partnership with the UN Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), Tobacco Control Board, Blue Cross Kisumu, ISSUP Kenya, Kenya Red Cross, Kenya AIDS NGOs Consortium (KANCO) amongst other key stakeholders from government and non-gvernmental organizations

# Leaders Dialogue on Climate Adaptation Action in Africa



The University hosted the leaders' dialogue on Adaptation Action in Africa in a blended event at Taifa Hall, on July 7, 2022. The dialogue was part of Africa's preparation for the Cop-27 conference to be held in Egypt in November, 2022. The event was attended by global leaders, the President His Excellency Uhuru Kenyatta; the Chancellor Dr. Vijoo Rattansi; staff and students.

Partnership Agreement of €1,200,000 between University of Nairobi and GCA under the Africa Adaptation Acceleration Programme (AAAP) was signed. The partnership aims to develop a robust pipeline of investment for resilient infrastructure in Kenya, unlocking climate finance, create green adaptation jobs, and to support Kenyan entrepreneurs scale up business solutions for climate resilient infrastructure.

# **Town Hall Discussion on Food Security and Climate Change**



In 2022, the university hosted a town hall discussion on innovating food security and climate change. The hybrid event was attended by a live audience drawn from universities in Kenya and other stakeholders and partners in the Africa region and beyond.

#### **International Wheelchair Day**

The 4th International Wheelchair day celebrations was held at the University's Chancellor's Court on March 1, 2022. during the celebrations, the university rededicated its efforts to provide wheel chairs, and to support and care for wheelchair users and make the world a better and more accessible place for people with mobility disabilities.



# Launch of International Union for Pure and Applied Chemistry (IUPAC) Global Women and Girls in Science

In 2022, the University, through the department of chemistry, and in collaboration with the International Science Programmes (ISP), Sweden through KEN 01 Project, launched the (IUPAC) Global Women and Girls in Science.

The launch, themed inclusive participation of gender in science for sustainable development, showcased the contribution of women and girls in science, and enhancing gender diversity. It also highlighted the fundamental role of basic sciences in achieving sustainable development goals. The department of chemistry also published an English/Kiswahili periodic table ".

#### **International Kiswahili Day**

In 2022, the University of Nairobi's department of Kiswahili had the honor of being the focal point of the celebration of International Kiswahili Day , a day recognized by UNESCO in collaboration with the Government of Kenya and Year of Return.

Kiswahili is one of the most widely used languages of the African family, and the most widely spoken in sub- Saharan Africa. It is among the 10 most widely spoken languages in the world, with more than 200 million speakers. It is also taught across major universities and colleges globally. Kiswahili language is one of the official languages of the African Union (AU), Southern African Development Community (SADC) and East African Community (EAC).

# ARUA Centre of Excellence for Unemployment and Skills Development-International Conference

In 2022, the Faculty of Business and Management Sciences hosted the hybrid 3<sup>rd</sup> African Research Universities Alliance-Centre of Excellence for Unemployment and Skills Development (ARUA, COE-USD)b on the theme: Sustainable and work place solutions for youth unemployment in Africa.

# 153rd Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi and 16th International Day of Non-Violence

In 2022, the university enjoined with the high commission for India to celebrate the 153rd birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. During the celebration, various dignitaries including Mr. Nasser Okoth, representative from Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Kenya; Dr. Kenneth Ombongi, Chairman of Kenya India Friendship Association (KIFA); Mr. Sharad Rao, a scholar, legal luminary and eminent diaspora member, as well as guests of Indian-origin empathized the significant contributions of Mahatma Gandhi to humanity and the continuing relevance of his teaching in today's world particularly the principles of truth and non-violence for peacefully resolving conflicts among society and nations.

# Advancing Public Health Research in Eastern African Through Data Science

In 2022, the University, in collaboration with the Columbia global center, hosted the first Advancing Public Health Research in Eastern Africa through Data Science Training (APHREA-DST) workshop.

The APHREA-DST project proposes to advance public health research in Eastern Africa by establishing new multi-tiered training programmes in health data science, with initial focus on Kenya and Ethiopia.

The launch was attended by participants from Columbia University, Addis Ababa University (AAU), and University of Nairobi; UoN leadership, faculty, students and guests from stakeholder organizations across the governmental, and non-governmental sectors.

# 4th Quadrennial Symposium on Brain Ageing and Dementia in Low and Middle Income Countries

In 2022, the university co-supported and cohosted this conference that brought together top scholars from all over the World to discuss risk factors and the increasing burden of vascular and neurodegenerative diseases. The discussions also centerd on HIV dementias in the context of incidence, modifiable risk factors, genetics, biomarkers, diagnosis and care.

# World Higher Education Conference (WHEC), 2022

In 2022, the University of Nairobi, Ain Shaws University, and the International Centre for Higher Education Innovation, under the auspices of UNESCO (UNESCO-ICHEI) co-hosted round table meetings on world education. The meeting focused on a shared future in higher education digital transformation. An exciting output of the meeting was research publications on how to digitize and transform higher education.

## **Visual Design Conference**

In 2022, the department of art and design organized and hosted a visual design conference, with the theme of the evolution of Afrikan visual design in the digital world. The Conference brought together design students, researchers, partners from the industry, and policymakers to reflect on three broad aspects of virtual reality, the future and the power too influence.

The conference was necessitated by a need to anchor Afrikan art and design on our strong cultural repository. The conference also tackled the role of virtual realty in gaming and animation based on the need to incorporate story telling and it inflence in the digital age.

#### **Post Cop-27 Africa Climate Adoption Conference:**

In 2022, the university hosted the Global centre on climate adaption in a post 27<sup>th</sup> Conference of the parties to the United Nations Framework convention on Climate Change (COP-27) Africa Climate Adoption Conference.

#### The 4th African Conference on Operations and Supply Chain Management

In 2022, the faculties of business management and agriculture with support from the African Centre of Excellence on Sustainable Operations for Resource Management and Food Supply, organised an African conference on operations and supply chain management. The conference was attended by participants from Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Nigeria, Ethiopia, United Kingdom and Germany.

The university used the biometric system which had been integrated with the student management information system to ensure the effective and efficient registration of the first year students. First year student undertakes Biometric registration upon reporting for studies.

#### **Vice Chancellor's Address**

The highlight of the admission process was the address by the Vice-Chancellor Prof. Stephen Kiama on September 22, 2022. The Vice-Chancellor further announced a new common course on entrepreneurship and innovation aimed at assisting students to develop their innovations and new ideas that lead to business opportunities.

The University of Nairobi attracts students from across the globe through its market driven and sustainable programme portfolio. This necessitated the need to take the first year International Students through an elaborate orientation programme involving key student services sections of the University. The Dean of Students Office and the International students Office particularly engaged the students during this orientation period.

The Dean of Student's Office through the various section leaders addressed the students and provided vital information to enable their life at the University easy and smooth. The orientation was carried out in partnership with Windle Trust, and took the students through the services offered by various offices of the University and how to seek assistance for help.

As part of the orientation process, students were taken through a week long sensitization programme on online solutions used by the University. The online training touched on amongst others goggle classroom and its features, the SMIS portal, zoom, SOMAS and E-class

#### **Monitoring Student Progress**

In 2022, the University enhanced efforts towards streamlining student progression by ridding the system of students whose studentship had expired, absconded; discontinued; expelled; suspended; deceased; and Inter/intra faculty transferred. During the year under review, 16,513 students were de-registered for the reasons mentioned above.

There were also students who had extended their studentship through formal requests to the Dean of Faculty and the names forwarded with recommendation by respective faculty academic committees to Senate for consideration and approval. 715 extension cases were processed.

A further 440 students who had graduated were cleared from the Student Management Information System. Further, the University restored hope to 57 previously dismissed students. A further 440 students who had graduated were cleared from the Student Management Information System.

# **National and International Recognition of Students**



Ferdinand Omanyala, was declared the fastest man in Africa. He won a gold medal in 100M at the  $22^{nd}$  African Senior Athletics Championship in Port-Louis, Mauritius; and the 2022 Commonwealth Games.

In 2022, our students gained recognition at international level receiving accolades and awards. ## **INFORMATION & COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY**

## **Fostering the Lecturer Examination Module**

In 2022, the University implemented the lecturer examination module within the student management information system. This Module enables the course leaders to accountably take charge of the course from scheduling, examination and entry of marks. The process of class attendance, examinations and processing of the marks is also done within the system. The University has further put in place proper back up and availability mechanisms to ensure that the data stored and systems for teaching are available in the secondary site.

## **Setting Up the Mtihani Module**

In 2022, the University set up a separate examination platform dedicated to online assessment and exams hosted on Mtihani.uonbi.ac.ke. This platform was further integrated with the student management information system to ensure automatic enrolment of students based on SMIS registration. The system was tried and tested with mock examinations in two faculties, and further, training of all faculties was conducted.

# **Installation of Smart Classroom as a Teaching Lab**

In 2022, the University of Nairobi, in collaboration with the International Centre for Higher Education Innovation under the auspices of UNESCO (UNESCO-ICHEI), and Ministry of Education, Science and Technology launched the smart classroom. the 50 capacity classroom is fitted with (1)

65" Smart Screen board and (3) 42" normal screens, speakers, cameras, document reader and LAN for internet connectivity.

Some of the key features of the Smart Classroom include, the learning management system, an interactive control center, class pad, interactive white boards, classroom control system, response pad, demand collaboration and on demand visual learning.

# **Enhancement of Local Area Network and Wifi**

In 2022, the ICT department undertook a project to extend the local area network infrastructure

at main campus and upgraded the speeds of its networks. The team further upgraded the WiFi network to enable students and lecturers access the internet during lectures. The targets completed included Kikuyu Campus, and the upper and lower State house halls of residence.

## **Reconfiguration of Taifa Hall**

The University ICT installed a new network infrastructure in Taifa Hall to upgrade its technological stature. These upgrades were implemented by the ICT communication and network infrastructure section.

# Consolidation of The UoN – Huawei Partnership

The University consolidated its partnership with Huawei ICT Academy and more specifically the management trainee program that targets recent graduates of various engineering courses. This programme provides the students with opportunities for personal and career growth through projects work exposure.

Further, the university, in collaboration with Huawei also organized ICT Job fairs, with the objectives of linking Telecom Companies with graduates for employment opportunity's.

## **Academy Support Center MoU**

In 2022, the University signed a new collaborative agreement with Huawei. under the agreement, Huawei will support an Academy Support Center (ASC) that promotes and provides support to the Huawei ICT Academies within Kenya. The academies are critical to training of trainers, certification, quality control and monitoring and evaluation of courses offered.

## **Student Training**

The demand for hands-on technical courses by STEM students is high. In 2022, 266 students enrolled in the ICT Competition, an additional fifteen students were shortlisted in national finals of the ICT competition.

# **Annual Christian Students Leadership Retreat**

In 2022, the Chaplaincy sponsored 110 students and leaders to the Annual Christian Students Leadership retreat in Kanamai. The students drawn from nine Campuses represented the Christian Union and the Catholic Students Community. The theme of the retreat was "Transformational Leadership".

## **Global leadership summit**

In 2022, 20 students were sponsored to attend the Global Leadership Summit 2022. This was a joint effort coordinated by the Chaplaincy and the Christian Leadership Centre (Ufungamano House). The theme of the summit was "Voice your Vision".

## Mentorship and internship

In 2022, the Christian Chaplains working in collaboration with the National Council of Churches of Kenya (NCCK) and Ufungamano (CSLC) organized, trained and commissioned a 6-month internship program for 12 students who completed their studies in the University. The program links students whose interest is to serve in Christian ministries in church and para-church organizations. This is a mentorship program and part of service to the community.

# The Association of Medical Students (AMSUN) Scientific Conference

In 2022, the association of medical students, held the Annual Scientific Conference with the theme of research today for a healthier tomorrow. The theme was a reminder of the importance of making resources available to support research on transforming the health of a future generation.

## **Engineering Students Conference**

The Engineering Students Association (ESA) held the 5th edition of the Annual International Engineering Students Conference (IESC 5.0) in march 2022. The conference brought together over 250 student engineers from various universities and industry players across the country. The theme for this year's conference was "Engineering for Humanity".

## **Economics Students Association (ECOSA) Career Talk**

In 2022, 180 students attended the Economics Students Association (ECOSA) career talk, with the theme of employability after Covid-19, which sought to explore the skill sets required in the job market. The students were exposed to the importance of hands on skills in complementing theories acquired in class, accounting knowledge, personal branding amongst other subjects. The trainers were drawn from consultancy firms, examining bodies such as KASNEB, the marketing society of Kenya, and the Institute of Economic Affairs.
